

Sheriff's Report

March 09, 2018

Randolph County Sheriff Mark Nichols reports the following incidents, reports, investigations and arrests.

On March 03rd, at 3:11 am, a deputy was dispatched to a location on Highway 63 in reference to a vehicle setting roadside that had been involved in an accident. The deputy located the vehicle. It appeared that the vehicle was involved in an accident with a deer. The deputy searched the area without locating the owner/operator.

On March 3rd at 3:27 pm, a deputy was dispatched to a location in the 1700 block of County Road 2955 in reference to a farm accident. Upon arrival, the deputy met with a family member of the victim. The family member reported that the victim was mauled by a cow. The victim was removed and transported to the hospital by RCAD.

On March 4th at 7:57 am, a deputy was dispatched to a location on Highway A south, in reference to a cow on or near the roadway. The deputy located the animal and herded it back in its pasture.

On March 04th at 10:33 am, a deputy was dispatched to a residence in the 100 block of Powell Street in Jacksonville. The complainant reported that a 5-year old child had left the house and was lost. A short time later, the child was located a short distance from his residence. No further action taken.

On March 04th at 5:10 pm, a deputy was dispatched to a residence in the 2700 block of Highway JJ, in reference to a domestic disturbance. The deputy interviewed both parties concerning the incident. Both parties stated that the ex-husband arrived at the residence and started a verbal argument over one of the children. The complainant requested that the ex-husband not return to the residence. The ex-husband was given a warning not to return.

On March 04th at 6:15 pm, a deputy was dispatched to the intersection of Highway C and County Road 1275 in reference to a motor vehicle accident. Upon arrival, the deputy located the vehicle but could not locate the owner/operator.

On March 05th at 1:39 am, a deputy was dispatched to a residence in the 4800 block of Highway P in reference to an alarm sounding. Upon arrival, the deputy checked the residence, finding it secure and undisturbed.

On March 05th at 10:00 am, a deputy met with a Moberly resident and received a missing person report. The complainant reported that her adult son is homeless and has not been seen since October 2017. The subject has been entered into MULES. The investigation continues.

On March 05th at 7:35 pm, a deputy was dispatched to a residence in the 100 block of East Randolph Street in Jacksonville in reference to an incorrigible juvenile. Upon arrival the deputy met with one parent and the juvenile. The deputy learned that the juvenile was yelling at his mother because an electronic device was taken from him for disciplinary reasons. The deputy advised the juvenile that game was a privilege and could be taken away if he acted up. No further action was needed.

On March 6th at 6:12 pm, a deputy was advised to contact a Moberly resident concerning a dog bite. The victim reported that she was retrieving her daughter up from the baby sitter when two dogs rushed out the door, knocked the victim down and bit her leg. Contact was made with the owner of the animals and was advised to quarantine the dogs for a 10-day observation period. A copy of the report has been forwarded to the Randolph County Health Department.

On March 07th at 5:30 pm, a deputy was dispatched to the 100 block of Baker Street in Cairo concerning an individual operating a vehicle in a careless manner. The deputy met with the suspect and spoke to him about the ramifications of his actions. The deputy also spoke to a parent of the suspect about the incident. No further actions taken.

On March 07th at 9:46 pm, a deputy was dispatched to a location in the area of Highway D and County Road 2210 in reference to a suspicious vehicle. The complainant reported that a black pickup pulled into a field entrance and extinguished its headlights. The deputy patrolled the area without locating any vehicles in the area matching the description given.

On March 02nd, Ashley Lynn Henderson, 29 of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant for failure to appear on three class A misdemeanor charges of stealing. Bond set at \$500 cash only. Henderson posted the required bond and released.

On March 05th, Andrea Renee Keffer, 29 of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant for failure to appear on an ordinance violation of vehicle license/inspection/title. Bond set at \$100 cash only. Keefer remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On March 05th, Aaron Wesley Hess, 53 of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant on two class D felony charges of possession of a controlled substance except 35 grams or less of

Marijuana/Synthetic Cannabinoid. Bond set at \$10,000 cash or surety. Hess posted the required bond and released.

On March 05th, Nicole Rene Burnett, 34 of Waynesville was served a Randolph County warrant for a probation violation on a class A misdemeanor charge of stealing leased or rented property. Bond set at \$500 cash only. Burnett posted the required bond and released.

On March 06th, Timothy Alan Barb, 32 of Huntsville was served a Randolph County warrant for a probation violation on a class C felony charge of assault – 2nd degree. Bond set at \$500 cash only. Barb posted the required bond and released.

On March 06th, Jesse Rocofeller Rodgers, 26 of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant for failure to appear on a class A misdemeanor charge of stealing leased or rented property. Bond set at \$175 cash only. Rodgers posted the required bond and released.

On March 8th, Travis Allan Koenig, 29 of Huntsville was served a Randolph County warrant for failure to appear on a class D misdemeanor charge of driving while revoked/suspended – 1st offense. Bond set at \$500 cash only. Koenig posted the required bond and released.

On March 8th, Christa Lynn Harris, 32 of Bevier was served a Randolph County warrant on a class D felony charge of possession of a controlled substance except 35 grams or less of Marijuana/Synthetic Cannabinoid. Bond set at \$10,000 cash or surety. Harris remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On March 8th, Kenneth Mayberry, 60 of Brookfield was served a Randolph County warrant for a probation violation on a class C felony charge of possession of a controlled substance except 35 grams or less of Marijuana. Bond set at \$20,000 cash only. Mayberry received a reduced bond, posted that required amount and was released.

On March 8th, Samson Gene Hess, 44 of rural Moberly was served two Randolph County warrants. Warrant one for a probation violation on a class B felony charge of distribute/deliver/manufacture/produce or attempt to or possess with intent to distribute/deliver/manufacture/produce a controlled substance and a class C felony charge of keeping or maintaining a public nuisance. Bond set at \$10,000 cash only. Warrant two for a probation violation on a class C felony charge of unlawful possession of a firearm and a class C felony charge of receiving stolen property. Bond set at \$10,000 cash only. Hess remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.
