

# Sheriff's Report

April 06, 2018

Randolph County Sheriff Mark Nichols reports the following incidents, reports, investigations and arrests.

On March 29<sup>th</sup> at 11:40 pm, a deputy overheard radio traffic concerning a vehicle pursuit in the City Limits of Moberly. The deputy positioned himself to assist. Moberly officers terminated the pursuit. The deputy fell in behind the suspect who refused to stop his vehicle. The deputy pursued the suspect vehicle to a location on County Road 1365 where he ran the vehicle into a farm field and became stuck. The individual was taken into custody and transported to the Randolph County Jail.

On March 30<sup>th</sup>, a rural Moberly resident was served an order for 96-hour detention, evaluation and treatment. The subject was transported to Missouri University Psychiatric Center in Columbia without incident.

On March 31<sup>st</sup> at 12:55 am, a deputy was requested to respond with RCAD to a residence in the 10000 block of North Highway 3 in reference to a possible overdose. Upon arrival, the deputy met with the victim who reported that he took an over the counter medication for a Migraine Headache, which caused a reaction. The victim agreed to be transported to the hospital for treatment and observation.

On April 3<sup>rd</sup>, a deputy was dispatched to a residence in the 14000 block of Highway C in reference to a report of trespass. Upon arrival, the deputy spoke with the complainant who reported that a subject was at the residence and was refusing to leave until law enforcement was contacted. No further action needed.

On April 4<sup>th</sup>, a rural Moberly resident was served an order for 96-hour detention, evaluation and treatment. The subject was transported to Missouri University Psychiatric Center in Columbia without incident.

On April 5<sup>th</sup>, a deputy was dispatched to the 1100 block of County Road 2275 in reference to a horse on the roadway. Upon arrival, the deputy patrolled the road twice, finding no horses out of confinement.

On April 5<sup>th</sup>, at 6:00 pm, a deputy was dispatched to a residence in the 200 block of Higbee in reference to a domestic disturbance. Upon arrival, the deputy met with a male subject who was threatening to set fire to his pickup truck. When the deputy inquired, the subject advised that his wife would not give him the keys to his truck. The deputy spoke with the female subject who advised that the male subject had threatened self-harm in the past. The female turned over the keys and the male subject departed the residence to stay in a motel. No further action taken.

On April 2<sup>nd</sup>, Tatiana Vasileff, 21 of rural Cairo was served a Randolph County warrant on a class C felony charge of manufacturing a controlled substance and a class E felony charge of keeping or maintaining a public nuisance. Bond set at \$20,000 cash or surety. Vasileff posted the required bond and released.

On April 2<sup>nd</sup>, Joshua Steven Knouse, 30 of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant on a class D felony charge of possession of a controlled substance except 35 grams or less of Marijuana/Synthetic Cannabinoid. Bond set at \$5,000 cash or surety. Knouse posted the required bond and released.

On April 2<sup>nd</sup>, Frank Angel Montes Jr., 49 of Columbia was served a Randolph County warrant for failure to appear on an unclassified misdemeanor charge of driving while revoked/suspended – 2<sup>nd</sup> or subsequent offense. Bond set at \$500 cash only. Montes posted the required bond and released.

On April 2<sup>nd</sup>, Mitchell Duane Nickerson, 46 of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant on a class E felony charge of driving while revoked/suspended. Bond set at \$5,000 cash or surety. Nickerson posted the required bond and released.

On April 2<sup>nd</sup>, Jordan James Searcy, 27 of Renick was served two Randolph County warrants. Warrant one for a probation violation on a class C felony charge of assault - 2<sup>nd</sup> degree and a class A misdemeanor charge of domestic assault – 3<sup>rd</sup> degree – 1<sup>st</sup>/2<sup>nd</sup> offense. Bond set at \$500 cash only. Warrant two on two class D felony charges of assault – 2<sup>nd</sup> degree and two unclassified felony charges of armed criminal action. Bond set at \$10,000 cash or surety. Searcy posted the required bond and released.

On April 2<sup>nd</sup>, Eric Vaughan Blanton, 20 of Macon was served a Randolph County warrant on a class B misdemeanor charge of driving while intoxicated. Bond set at \$2,500 – 10% cash allowed. Blanton posted the required bond and released.

On April 4<sup>th</sup>, Cameron Lane Craig, 19 was served a Randolph County warrant for failure to obey a judge's order on a class D felony charge of possession of a controlled substance except 35

grams or less of Marijuana/Synthetic Cannabinoid. Bond set at \$3,500 cash only. Craig remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On April 4<sup>th</sup>, Joseph Charles Guinn, 24 of rural Salisbury was served a Randolph County warrant on a class E felony charge of resisting arrest/detention/stop by fleeing – creating a substantial risk of serious injury/death to any person. Bond set at \$10,000 cash only. Guinn remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On April 4<sup>th</sup>, Christopher Jackson Cox, 29 of Pacific, MO was served a Randolph County warrant on a class D felony charge of possession of a controlled substance except 35 grams or less of Marijuana/Synthetic Cannabinoid. Bond set at \$2,500 cash or surety. Cox remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On April 4<sup>th</sup>, Katherine Ann Wright, 25 of Harrisburg was served a Randolph County warrant for failure to appear on a class D misdemeanor charge of operated vehicle on highway without a valid license – 1<sup>st</sup> offense. Bond set at \$130 cash only. Wright posted the required bond and released.

On April 4<sup>th</sup>, Rachel Lynn Grissom, 26 of Macon was served two warrants. Warrant one from Macon County on a felony charge of possession of a controlled substance. Bond set at \$20,000 cash only. Warrant two from Adair County on a class D misdemeanor charge of stealing – value less than \$150 and no prior stealing offenses. Bond set at \$500 cash only. Grissom was released to Macon County authorities.

On April 4<sup>th</sup>, Tysen T. Harris, 24 of St. Joseph was served a probation and parole violation warrant, original charge of felony aggravated assault on law enforcement – weapon. No bond set. Harris remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On April 4<sup>th</sup>, Thomas John Jewett, 44 of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant on a class D felony charge of burglary – 2<sup>nd</sup> degree. Bond set at \$25,000 cash only. Jewett remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On April 6<sup>th</sup>, David W. Johnson, 25 of Moberly was served two Randolph County warrants. Warrant one for failure to appear on an infraction of driver/front seat passenger failed to wear properly adjusted/fastened safety belt. Bond set at \$50 cash only. Warrant two for failure to appear on a class D misdemeanor charge of owner operated motor vehicle without maintaining financial responsibility – 1<sup>st</sup> offense. Bond set at \$150 cash only. Johnson posted the required bond and released.
