## Sheriff's Report

May 18, 2018

Randolph County Sheriff Mark Nichols reports the following incidents, reports, investigations and arrests.

On May 11<sup>th</sup>, a deputy was dispatched to a location on Highway 63, north of Jacksonville in reference to an individual who was reported to be walking on the Highway. The deputy located the pedestrian. The deputy inquired as to why he was walking on the Highway. The subject advised that he was walking to work. The deputy provided the subject a ride to his place of employment.

On May 11<sup>th</sup>, a deputy was dispatched to a residence in the 100 block of Wabash St. in Clark in reference to a report of property damage. Upon arrival, the deputy met with the complainant who reported that someone attempted to cut two tires on his Volkswagen passenger vehicle but failed. The investigation continues.

On May 11<sup>th</sup>, a deputy received a property damage complaint from a County Road 1860 resident. The complainant reported that while she was away from the residence, someone damaged her 2016 Hyundai Elantra by hitting and kicking the vehicle, causing numerous dents over the entire vehicle. Photographs were taken of the damage. The investigation continues.

On May 11<sup>th</sup>, a deputy received a theft report from an individual who claimed that someone stole a PlayStation 4 console and two controllers from his residence. The complainant provided the name of a possible suspect. The deputy is attempting to locate the individual for questioning. The investigation continues.

On May 11<sup>th</sup>, a deputy was dispatched to a residence in the 5900 block of East Highway 24 in reference to suspicious activity. The complainant reported that he was the owner of a 6-month old bloodhound and that the dog unexpectedly became ill and died. The complainant was taking the deceased animal to the vet to attempt to learn why the dog died. The investigation continues.

On May 11<sup>th</sup>, a deputy received a phone call from a Special Road District employee who reported illegal trash dumping on County Road 2270. The complainant advised the deputy that someone had dumped 14 trash bags full of trash. A name was located and the deputy responded to the residence, to find it vacant. The deputy is attempting to locate the suspect.

On May 12<sup>th</sup>, a deputy received a domestic assault report. The victim reported that the assault occurred at a location in the County. The victim reported that her boyfriend assaulted her by punching her in the arm, slamming her against a vehicle door and slapping her in the face. The victim had bruising consistent with her claim. Photographs were taken of the injuries. The deputy is attempting to locate the suspect who is believed to be in Boone County. The investigation continues.

On May 12<sup>th</sup>, a deputy was dispatched to a residence on Private Road 1336 in reference to a burglary. The complainant reported that someone forced entry into the residence and stole a Black N Decker drill, a yellow Rubbermaid toolbox, a ¼ inch socket set, a DeWalt drill bit set and a posthole digger. Photographs were taken at the scene. The investigation continues.

On May 13<sup>th</sup>, a deputy was dispatched to the Westran High School in reference to a report of vandalism. The complainant reported that someone moved 2-metal benches from their normal location to the center of the parking lot and broke numerous eggs on the parking lot. Photographs were taken at the scene. The report will be forwarded to the Huntsville Police Department for further investigation.

On May 15<sup>th</sup>, a deputy was dispatched to a location on County Road 2570 in reference to a one car motor vehicle accident. Upon arrival, the deputy observed the driver to be lying next to his vehicle. The deputy noted an odor of intoxicating beverage omitting from the driver. A Missouri State Trooper arrived and conducted the accident investigation and the driver was transported to a hospital in Columbia by RCAD. The deputy remained on scene until the vehicle was towed from the scene.

On May 16<sup>th</sup>, deputies were dispatched to the 700 block of Highway A in reference to a domestic disturbance. Upon arrival, deputies met with two male subjects who were family members who were involved in a verbal argument about farm equipment. After a short discussion, one party left the property with a tractor. No further action taken.

On May 16<sup>th</sup>, while patrolling Highway A, a deputy observed a vehicle with a registration violation. The deputy initiated a traffic stop and identified the operator. The deputy learned that the license of the operator was revoked. The operator was arrested and transported to the Randolph County Jail.

On May 14<sup>th</sup>, Tia Louise Goble of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant on a class B misdemeanor charge of peace disturbance – 1<sup>st</sup> offense. Own recognizance bond authorized. Goble was released on her own recognizance by the court.

On May 14<sup>th</sup>, Damon Darrell Mason of Macon was served a Randolph County warrant for a probation violation on a class B felony charge of distribute/deliver/manufacture/produce or

attempt to or possess with intent to distribute/deliver/manufacture/produce a controlled substance and a class D felony charge of driving while revoked/suspended. Bond set at \$25,000 cash or surety. Mason remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On May 14<sup>th</sup>, Ann Marie Smith of Salisbury was served a Randolph County warrant on a class E felony charge of driving while intoxicated – physical injury. Bond set at \$2,500, 10% cash allowed. Smith posted the required bond and released.

On May 15<sup>th</sup>, Dylan Lee Johnston of Moberly was served Randolph County warrant on a class D felony charge of tampering with a motor vehicle – 1<sup>st</sup> degree. Bond set at \$10,000 cash or surety. Johnston posted the required bond and released.

On May  $15^{th}$  and  $16^{th}$ , Brandon Alexander Tolson of Moberly was served two Randolph County warrants. Warrant one for failure to appear on two class B felony charges of assault  $-1^{st}$  degree or attempt, a class D felony charge of endangering the welfare of a child creating substantial risk  $-1^{st}$  degree  $-1^{st}$  offense - sexual contact, a class D felony charge of tampering with a motor vehicle  $-2^{nd}$  degree, a class B misdemeanor charge of trespass  $1^{st}$  degree, a class a misdemeanor charge of assault  $4^{th}$  degree and a class A misdemeanor charge of stealing. Bond set at \$15,000 cash only. Warrant two for failure to appear on a class E felony charge of harassment  $-1^{st}$  degree. Bond set at \$15,000 cash only. Tolson remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On May 16<sup>th</sup>, Shawn Christopher Reese of Moberly was served three Randolph County warrants. Warrant one for failure to appear on a class A misdemeanor charge of driving while revoked/suspended – 2<sup>nd</sup> or 3<sup>rd</sup> offense. Bond set at \$250 cash only. Warrant two on two class B felony charges of distribution of a controlled substance other than 35 grams or less of Marijuana and a class D felony charge of possession of a controlled substance other than 35 grams or less of Marijuana. Bond set at \$25,000 cash only. Warrant three on a class E felony charge of resisting arrest/detention/stop by fleeing, creating a substantial risk of serious injury or death to any person. Bond set at \$5,000 cash or surety. Reese remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On May  $16^{th}$ , Nicholas Gene Fainter of Renick was served three Randolph County warrants. Warrant one for failure to appear on a class D misdemeanor charge of driving while revoked/suspended –  $1^{st}$  offense. Bond set at \$150 cash or surety. Warrant two for failure to appear on a class A misdemeanor charge of driving while revoked/suspended –  $2^{nd}$  or  $3^{rd}$  offense. Bond set at \$150 cash or surety. Warrant three for failure to appear on a class A misdemeanor charge of driving while revoked/suspended –  $2^{nd}$  or  $3^{rd}$  offense. Bond set at \$250 cash only. Fainter remains in the Randolph County Jail in lieu of the required bond.

On May 17<sup>th</sup>, Shelly Gwen Easton a/k/a Shelly Easton a/k/a Shelly G. Dutton of Moberly was served a Randolph County warrant for failure to appear on a class B misdemeanor charge of failure to register a motor vehicle. Bond set at \$150 cash only. Easton posted the required bond and released.
